

Eremias nigrocellata NIKOLSKY, 1896

Black-ocellated Racerunner

Global range: Afghanistan, Iran, Tajikistan, Turkmenistan, and Uzbekistan.

Distribution in Iran: Provinces of Golestan, Razavi Khorasan, South Khorasan, Semnan, Sistan and Baluchestan.

Biology: The Black-ocellated Racerunner lives on hard, clayey soil mixed with sand or gravel and covered with annual plants. This species is found in arid and semi-arid regions at elevations of 1,300–1,700 m. It quickly buries itself at the slightest sign of danger.

Size: Snout–vent length 83 mm, tail length 100 mm.
